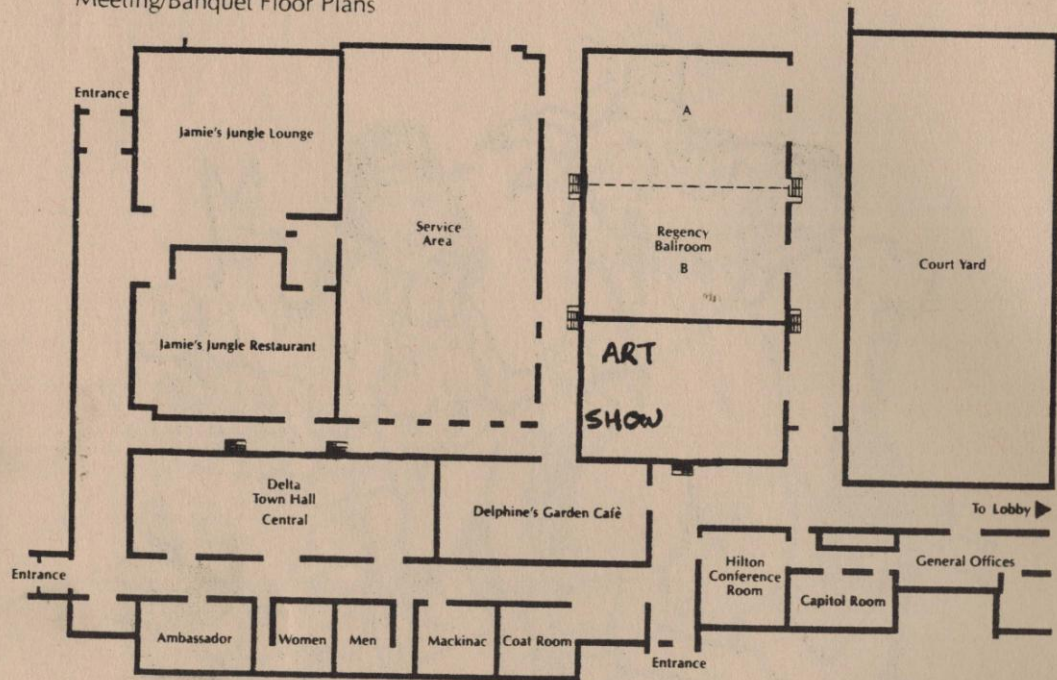

Fan Q's

The Fan Quality Awards were originated by Sharon Ferraro (Short) and Paula Smith in conjunction with SekWester*Con, Too in 1977. The categories in that year were Best Author/Writer and Best Artist. Leslie Fish won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for "The Weight" series), and Connie Faddis won for Best Artist.

The categories remained the same in 1978 at T'Con, and Leslye Lilker won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for the Sahaj series), and Alice Jones won for Best Artist.

With the same categories remaining in 1979 for 2'Con, Maggie Nowakowska won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for her ThousandWorlds series--the first time a non-STAR TREK nominated item won in the brief history of the Fan Q's), and Martynn won for Best Artist.

When Joyce Yasner and Devra Langsam chaired Mos'Eastly in 1980, with Linda Deneroff as Fan Q Co-ordinator, the categories were changed to Best Author/Writer (Mary Lee Cascio and Lois Welling for "Executive Privilege" in RIGEL 4,5,6 ...), Best Artist (Hans Dietrich), and Best Editor (Lori Chapek-Carleton).

As a result of majority decision by all interested fans participating at Mos'Eastly, the 1981 categories at MediaWest*Con I are Favorite Fanzine, Favorite Long Story, Favorite Short Story, Favorite Poem, and Favorite Single Piece of Artwork. The winners this year will be announced following the Saturday banquet.

Those people attending first the KWest*Cons, then the Lansing cons, and Mos'Eastly last year, have reflected fandom's changing trends. The Fan Q's are essentially a popularity contest, with (one hopes) emphasis on the quality inherent in the most popular fandoms our attendees are involved in. Congratulations to the past winners, and to this year's winners and nominees. It's not too late to start thinking of the 1982 nominations, for items published in the 1981 calendar year!

Concerning this year's Fan Q's ... we wish to make special note that Olivia Bottum submitted the first ballot in nominations, and Desi Bell was the first to turn in her vote!

THE BID: Carey Handfield & Andrew Taubman are jointly chairing the bid & ~~the bid~~ have been involved in running most of the cons held in Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide & Perth over the past 12 years. The team has experience.

THE SITE: The site is the New Chevron Hotel in the Kings Cross area of Sydney. Kings Cross is a 24 hour entertainment area & has been the site of previous cons. The Hyatt just down the street was the site of the parties to welcome and say goodbye to the folk who attended AUSSIECON I. Over 30 restaurants of many cuisines are located within a five minute walk. Several hotels are located practically adjacent to the New Chevron for use as overflow hotels. The New Chevron has been recently thoroughly refurbished & is being expended to about twice its current size. The rooms, mostly with magnificent views of Sydney, its harbour, bridge and Opera House, are oversized by modern standards, and room rates are lower than the major International chain hotels. Sydney's Climate is similar to San Francisco's, with the season's reversed. However, if you are going to do a bit of travelling before or after the con, you will be able to find the climate of your choice: The Snowy Mts. for skiing; Ayers Rock for desert solitude, Brisbane & north along the coast for surfing; The Barrier Reef for under the water; Darwin and Northern Queensland for Tropical Rain Forests; the Outback for fossicking after gold or opal, etc. What ever you want, Australia has it.

Eats, etc.

Eats and Places of Interest

On the local guide, the farthest place listed is Connor's Steak House, 3.6 miles east of the Hilton. On the general reference map, the farthest place listed is the M.S.U. campus, 18.5 miles east of the Hilton. Except for a couple of gas stations, there is virtually nothing west of the Hilton. What follows is a guide of sorts of varying places to eat, gas station locations, banks, pharmacies, grocery stores, and the like.

fast foods-
Rax Roast Beef, Dog'n'Suds, Burger King, approx. 2 miles east of the Hilton, will probably open the usual hours over the entire weekend
Kentucky Fried Chicken, Taco Bell, Arby's, McDonalds, Wendy's, approx. 3 miles east of the Hilton, will probably open the usual hours over the entire weekend.

sit-down restaurants, a cut above fast foods-
Denny's--across from the Hilton, open 24 hours.
Landmark--open 24 hours thru Saturday, closed Sunday and Monday
Elias Brothers' Big Boy--about two miles east of the Hilton
Bill Knapps, Holly By Golly--just a shade farther, with Ponderosa Steak House, Friendly's, and Sambo's a little further down the line. Sambo's is open 24 hours. These are all cheap to moderate-priced restaurants; check the phone book if you need to know their hours.

sit-down restaurants, slightly nicer and getting more expensive-\$ to \$\$
Hoffman House--at the Midway, it's a hotel restaurant
Jamie's Jungle--at the Hilton, it's a hotel restaurant
Mr. Steak--about \$7-\$10 average, 2 miles east of the Hilton
Connor's Steak House is open 24 hours, about \$8 maximum
Emil's isn't as highly priced as some in this category, and is open 'til midnight.

Frondor (check the general reference map)-\$ to \$\$
Red Lobster--open 'til 10-11 p.m., up to \$11 dinners
Ground Round--opens even later, \$8-\$9 maximum
Grande Gourmet closed Sunday and Monday, but open 'til then 'til 6. Serves breakfast.
VeeGee's--all you can eat in Dutch style restaurant for \$5.95. Open 'til 10 p.m. Saturday, 7 p.m. Sunday.
For the Chinese food freaks, two very good restaurants! Apple Jade is open Saturday 'til 10 p.m., closed Sunday and Monday; prices get as high as \$7! Yat Wah will be open daily and has prices similar to Apple Jade, plus a higher range.

Machus Red Fox--closed Mondays, prices to \$15
Mountain Jacks--seafood and beef, prices to \$20 or so

munchies, sundries, catch-alls
Lansing Mall (lots of stores, not open terribly late most days)
K-Mart--discount department store
Meijers--discount department and grocery store, open 'til 10:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, 'til 7 p.m. Sunday.
Quality Dairy, Edgewood Shopping Center--varying hours.

doughnuts
Dawn Donuts--24 hrs., 3 miles east of the Hilton.
Paul's Pastries--Mom & Pop high quality stuff, 5 miles east of the Hilton. Easy to miss. On the left.

pizza
Sir Pizza--will deliver. Check phone book for others.

Across from the Hilton, Horrock's Farm Market is open from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily and has fresh produce as well as junkier food munchies. Nice flowers, too.

The Regional Red Cross Bloodcenter is east on Saginaw, turn left on N. Fairview, and left on Grand River. Follow the signs; about 8 miles east of the Hilton.

Just about anything you might need is available going east of the Hilton on Saginaw. Since Saginaw is a one way street past the Edgewood Shopping Center, if you venture further, just make a left when you want to come back, and turn left again onto Oakland. If you want to take Saginaw to Grand River towards campus (or further), the local SF bookstore is Curious Books across from campus. Call first, as they keep strange hours. Down by Frandor on Michigan is the Silver Dollar, which has a nice restaurant, and Gordon Carleton painted the murals in the bar section, which may or may not be of interest to you. The Silver Dollar has dynamite pizza, though.
