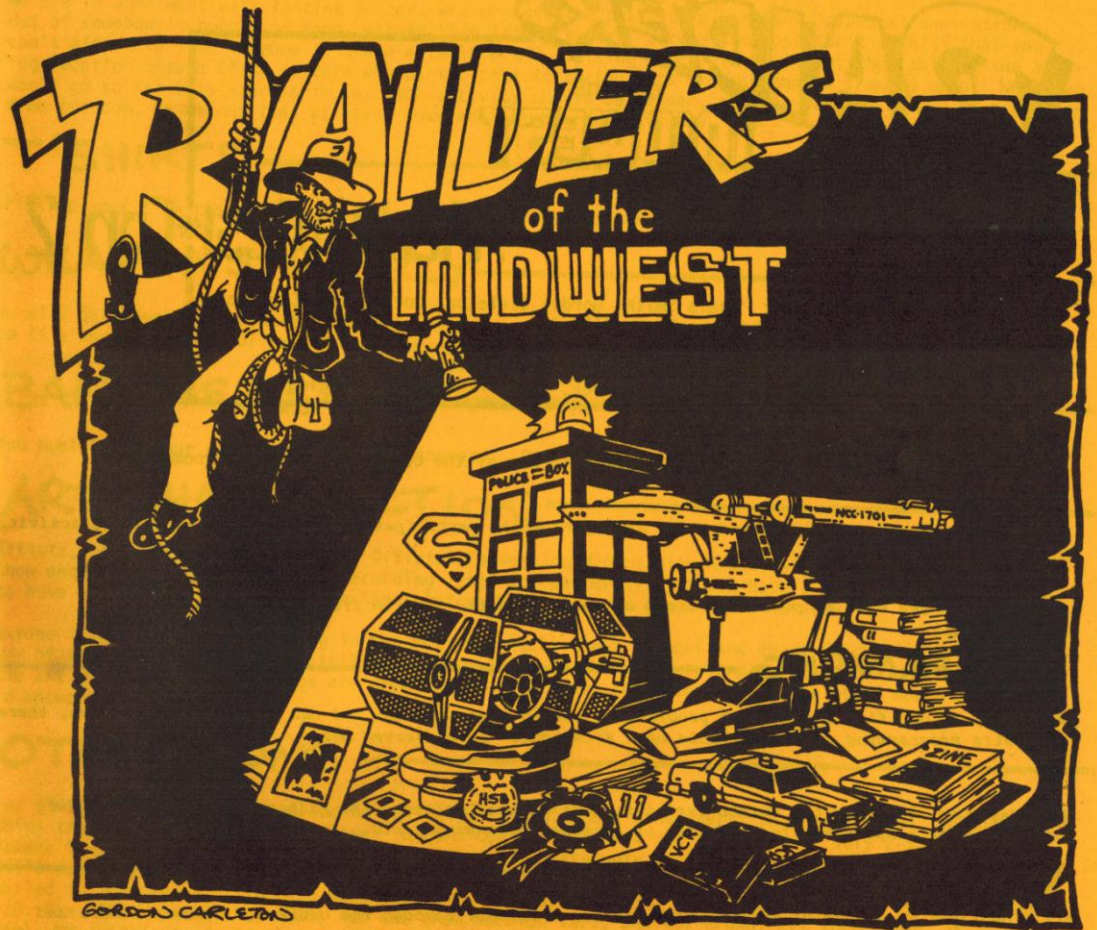

NEXT YEAR

We are now accepting s.a.s.e.s for notification of next year's MediaWest*Con III, to be held over Memorial Day Weekend, 1982 at the Hilton Inn--Lansing. Flyers will go out as soon as we've recovered from MediaWest*Con II.

The Media-Oriented Fan Fund (formerly the STAR TREK Fan Fund) was founded by the editors of *Halkan Council* to financially enable STAR TREK fans to attend a convention they would otherwise not be able to attend. The first winner was chosen under the auspices of *Halkan Council*. The second year, it was sponsored by T'Kuhtian Press in connection with T'Con, 1978, with Carol Hydeman as Co-ordinator. Carol Armour was the Co-ordinator for the third year. Since then, Carol Hydeman has regained the position.

As media fandom has grown, the Fan Fund has been extended to incorporate it, and now members of all media-related fandoms are eligible. Over the years, the Fan Fund has had a fairly diverse selection of winners, and fans in various parts of the world have gotten to meet people they previously knew only from letters.

The previous winner of the Fan Fund, and the cons they attended, have been:

Carry Downes -- SeKWester*Con II, 1977
 Ann Looker -- August Party, 1978
 Kay Johnson -- Terracon, 1979 (England)
 Toni Cardinal-Price -- STAR TREK America, 1980
 Susan Matthews -- MediaWest*Con I, 1981

This year's winner is Valerie Piacentini, of Scotland, who will travel with Lori Chapek- and Gordon Carleton to ChiCon IV. Look them up there! Poison Pen Press sponsored it in connection with Mos'Eastly Con, and T'Kuhtian Press regained sponsorship in 1981 in connection with MediaWest*Con.

Deborah June Laymon will be the coordinator of the 1983 Fan Fund, and is helping this year's coordinator, Carol Hydeman, at the con.

FAN Q

Remember, voting for the Fan Q's will be allowed 'til noon Saturday. Those of you who haven't voted yet had better, as we have to get at least 1/3 of this year's attending membership to participate in a quorum, or else, what's the point? We've got the Fan Q Nominees Booklet available containing excerpts from the fiction and art nominated, and it only costs \$2. If you're too cheap or too broke to buy it, you can look through it before you vote. And we'll have as many copies of the 'zines involved in the nominees process as possible available for going through, though you won't be able to leave the room with them.

The Fan Quality Awards were originated by Sharon Ferraro (Short) and Paula Smith in conjunction with SeKWester*Con, Too in 1977. The categories in that year were Best Author/Writer and Best Artist. Leslie Fish won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for "The Weight" series), and Connie Faddis won for Best Artist.

The categories remained the same in 1978 at T'Con, and Leslye Lilker won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for the Sahaj series), and Alice Jones won for Best Artist.

With the same categories remaining in 1979 for 2'Con, Maggie Nowakowska won for Best Author/Writer (primarily for her ThousandWorlds series--the first time a non-STA TREK nominated item won in the brief history of the Fan Q's), and Martynn won for Best Artist.

When Joyce Yasner and Devra Langsam chaired Mos'Eastly in 1980, with Linda Dener as Fan Q Co-ordinator, the categories were changed to Best Author/Writer (Mary Lee Caio and Lois Welling for "Executive Privilege" in RIGEL 4,5,6 ...), Best Artist (Hans Dietrich), and Best Editor (Lori Chapek-Carleton).

As a result of majority vote by all interested fans participating at Mos'Eastly, the 1982 categories at MediaWest*Con I were Favorite Fanzine (SKYWALKER 4 won), Favorite Long Story (ONE WAY MIRROR, by Barbara Wenk won), Favorite Short Story ("Imperial Soliloquy" by Barbara Wenk won), Favorite Poem ("Starsame" by Paula Block won), and Favorite Single Artwork (Joni Wagner won, for p. 25 of FACETS 4).

Again, last year changes were made, and the 1982 Fan Q categories are Best 'Zine, Best Artist, and Best Writer, in three categories--Star Trek, Star Wars, and Other Media. The winners this year will be announced following the Saturday banquet.

The Fan Q's have reflected fandom's changing trends, and while we view them as essentially a popularity content, with emphasis (we hope) on the quality in the most popular fandoms our attendees are involved in, we hope they accurately reflect quality. Let us know how you liked this year's categories, and give us suggestions for next year. It's not too late to start thinking of the 1983 nominations, for items published in the 1982 calendar year!

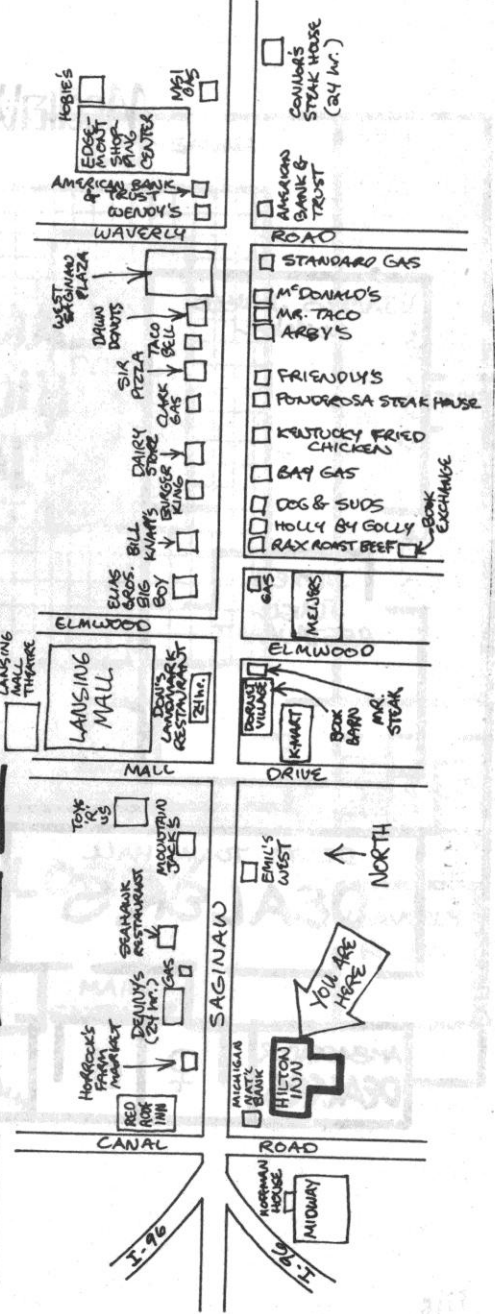

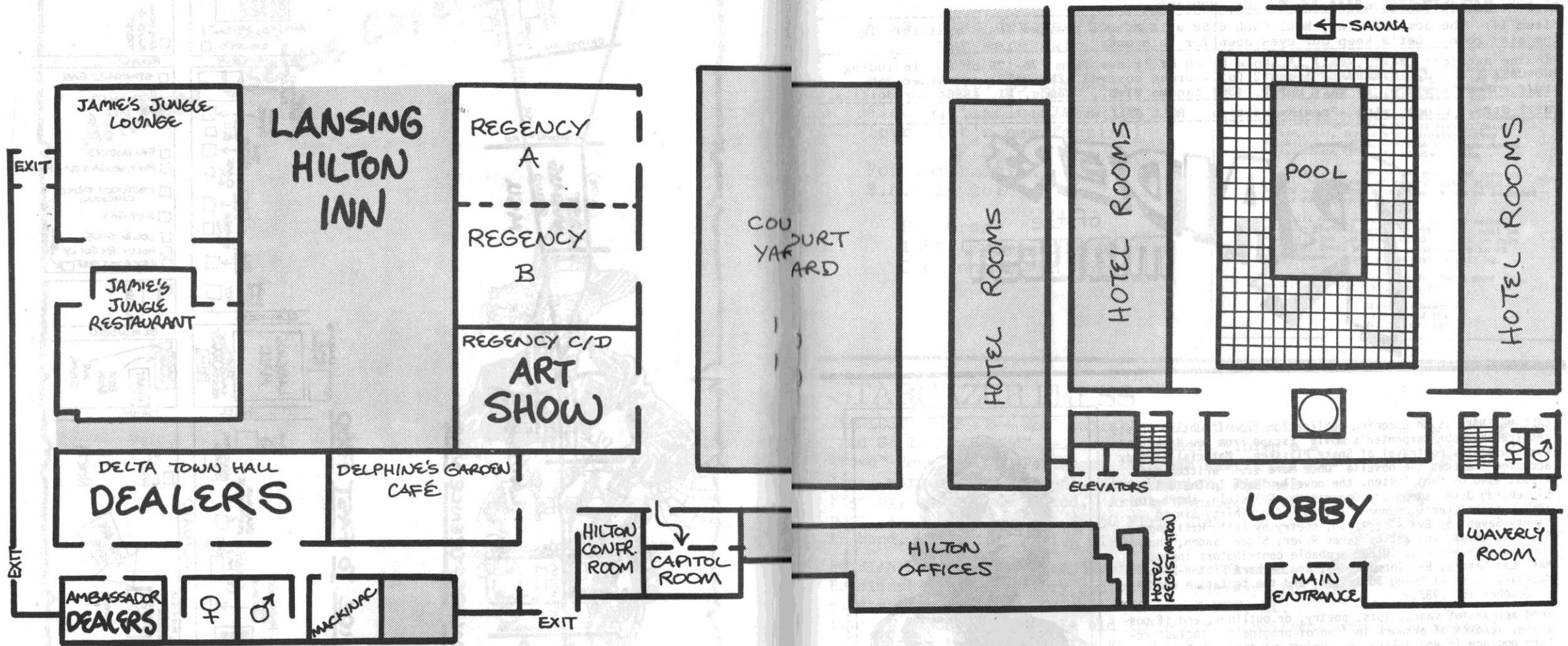


GENERAL REFERENCE MAP

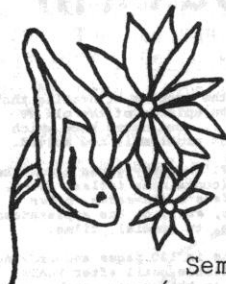

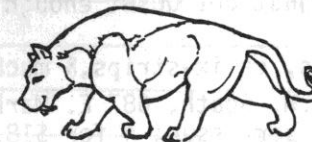

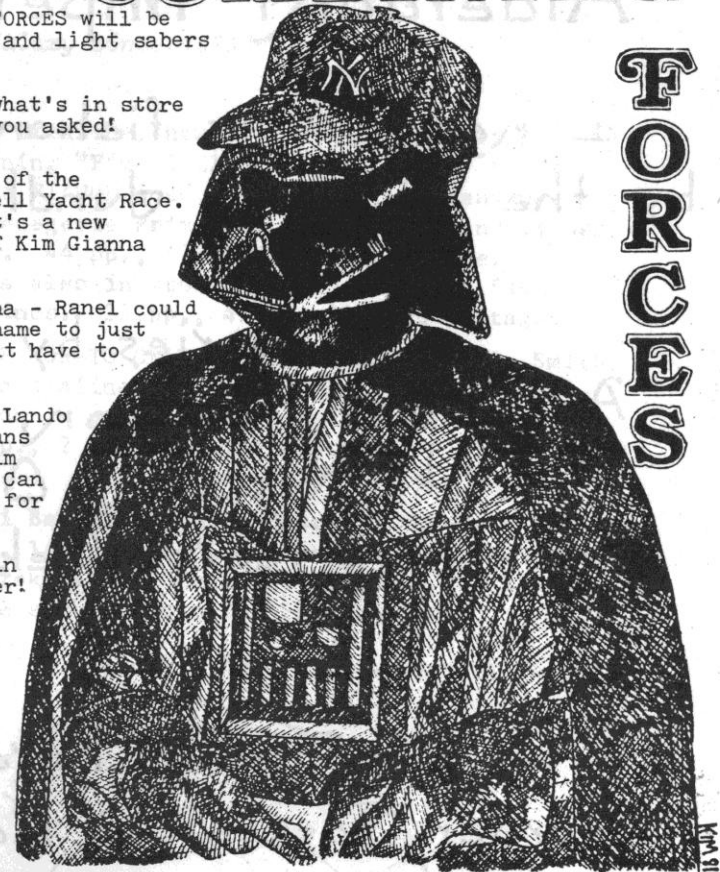
