Fannish Videos, Masquerade, Dealers' Room, SF/Media Fan Fund, Fan Quality Awards, a Con Suite (AKA Hospitality Suite) and a Party Suite, and many, many panels on a wide variety of topics representing many areas of interest. Programming is determined by member input and participation. Programming is intended for an adult audience; we do not censor adult themes in panel topics or in the Art Show. We have no official guests. The name MediaWest*Con is a service mark of MediaWest*Con.

You have made MediaWest*Con the definitive gathering of SF/Media fandom. Held each Memorial Day Weekend in Lansing Michigan, MediaWest*Con is sponsored by T'Kuhtian Press as a celebration of the diversity of SF/Media fandom, run by fans, for fans, and is not intended for profit. MediaWest*Con is staffed entirely by volunteers. Welcome to new members, and to past members, welcome back!

Programming is determined by member input and participation, and is intended for an adult audience. Adult guardians of minor children are responsible for their actions. We do not censor adult content in panel topics or Art Show displays. Panels are Gen unless labeled otherwise.

Programming

Programming at MediaWest*Con is conducted under the philosophy of IDIC (Infinite Diversity in Infinite Combination); differences of opinion are to be expected, but personal attacks will not be tolerated.

Daily programming schedules, an index of programming (grouped by actors, events, fandom, fan fiction, internet, literature, movies, TV, TV crossovers/multimedia, video, workshops/demos, and other), and a map of the hotel layout are elsewhere in this Program Book. A grid version of the daily program schedule is also included with your membership materials.

Some time slots may be available for "unscheduled" presentations — just clear use of the room with Dawn & Elyse, and then post notices in the designated areas.

Videos can be scheduled in the Fannish Video Room (Executive Training Room) or Main Video Room (Imperial Rooms) or Con Suite (Suite 463). Check program postings outside each rooms and check with Sheryl Adsit for Fannish Videos. Robyn Deike for the Main Video Room, or Jeanne Sullivan in the Con Suite to schedule a video you've brought and would like shown.

Due to a scheduling glitch, MW*C 28 souvenir items will not ne available at the con. However, this means you will be able to order additional items while you are here! MW*C 28 souvenirs will be shipped after the con.

Code of the [Media]West[*Con]

There is NO SMOKING allowed in any public area of the convention center (including hallways and elevators), with the exception of Hummingbird's.

Convention functions are for the use of MediaWest*Con 28 members only, and the convention reserves the right to refuse admittance to any non-member, other than hotel staff.

No memberships will be available at the door. Memberships are not transferable.

The membership of anyone found "sharing" a badge with a non-member for the purpose of admittance will be revoked without refund, and both parties may be denied membership to future **MediaWest*Cons**.

Anyone found carrying an illegal substance or weapon, acting in an unruly or obnoxious manner, or otherwise causing a disturbance, may have their membership revoked without refund, and be denied admittance for the duration of the convention and/or future conventions.

Simulated weaponry should be handled with discretion, and only inside the hotel. Edged weapons should remain sheathed (except as part of an authorized display or demonstration).

Pets are not allowed in the Art Show, Dealers' Room (except those belonging to Dealers), and the hotel restaurant. Limited temporary pet-sitting space will be available in the Board Room (behind MW*C registration). GoFers/Security posted at doors to function rooms will not hold pets for members entering no-pet areas. Pets left in hotel rooms should be secured in crates, carriers, or other appropriate containers, both for their own safety and to facilitate housekeeping. Pets should be on leashes or under similar restraint in convention areas. Pets who become upset or unmanageable should be removed. Please keep pets toward the back, right-hand side of audience seating at all panels, etc. See the map on the back of this Program Book for designated dog-walk areas. Please pick up after your dog with the tools provided in these areas. Emergency clean-up materials will be available at MediaWest*Con registration, in case of accidents; also, hotel personnel will clean up accidents if you notify the front desk.

Anyone wishing to videotape **MediaWest*Con** panels or activities should indicate this intent at convention registration.

There will be no photography allowed in the Art Show or Auction.

Flyers: Flyers may only be distributed by MediaWest*Con members, or through MediaWest*Con staff (flyers from non-members may be sent c/o the MW*C address). Once again, everyone is asked to refrain from posting signs or putting out flyers until Thursday afternoon. Official MediaWest*Con 28 signs will be posted on the Atrium pillars indicating where various sorts of notices should be posted. As soon as these signs are posted in the Atrium, flyers and signs may be placed in those designated areas.

Posting is limited to the designated areas in the Atrium; stacks may be placed in the Atrium and on flyer tables near MW*C registration or other designated areas. Please remember that signs may only be posted on wood, glass or marble, and only with low tack masking tape. A limited quantity of low-tack tape will be available at MediaWest*Con registration. Flyers attached with other tape, or in non-designated areas (such as wallpaper), may be removed and disposed of. Also, due to the limited flyer space around the Atrium, everyone is asked to limit each of their flyers to one stack only.

Subject matter of flyers must be of general fannish interest ('zines, party announcements, cons, etc.), not of a personal nature, and be presented in a reasonably, tasteful manner -- please remember that the general public can easily read flyers in public areas of the hotel. Please remove outdated flyers and signs promptly.

Flyers not in keeping with these guidelines will be removed and disposed of. **MediaWest*Con** is not responsible for the specific content or accuracy of any flyers.

Door decorations: You must use low-tack materials only (such as low-tack masking tape or Post-It products), nothing permanent or damaging (such as duct tape, 2 sided foam tape, or cellophane tape on wallpaper), and to remove your door decorations before you check out.

Please bring any violations of these rules to the immediate attention of **MediaWest*Con** security; there is very little we can do when we don't hear about something until weeks (or months) later. Convention Co-Chairs Lori and Gordon are the final arbiters of these rules.

GoFers

GoFer Headquarters is the Con Suite (Suite #463). Check in before you do anything else and follow all instructions. Thank you for volunteering, and we welcome your assistance.

Con Suite

The MW*C Con Suite (463) is open to all members during convention hours, and will be stocked with a variety of soft drinks and munchies. The Con Suite also serves as convention and GoFer headquarters.

PLEASE NOTE: The Con Suite will be on a non-smoking floor.

Jeanne will also be showing videos, including movie trailers and season and series finales. Look for the schedule posted outside the Con Suite, and check with Jeanne for any requests in open timeslots.

Communications

We plan to set up a "Voodoo Message Board" in the vicinity of Convention Registration for the duration of the convention. It works as follows: an alphabetical print-out of the MediaWest*Con 28 membership roster is posted. Push pins are available, and anyone wishing to leave a message for a specific person finds that person's name on the print-out. If a push pin is not already placed to the immediate left of the name (indicating a message is already waiting), place a push pin there. Then write the desired message on an index card (or other piece of paper) and place it alphabetically in the file box provided next to the roster (behind the alphabetical divider for the appropriate letter of the last name of the person the message is for). When checking your name for messages, remove the push pin from the left of your name when retrieving your messages from the message box. Simple, nu?

Please do **NOT** leave messages for Lori and Gordon via the Voodoo Message Board. Messages may be left for Lori and Gordon at **MediaWest*Con** registration and in the Con Suite; messages for Gordon may also be left in the Art Show. As these are areas where Lori and Gordon can usually be found, messages will get to them much quicker. As always, either Lori or Gordon (or both) will be available on site during convention hours throughout the weekend.

There will be a designated area near MW*C registration for postings by people seeking rooms, roommates, or rides, and for official announcements.

There will be designated areas on the Atrium pillars for official announcements and for announcements of parties and other events. Please post only in these designated areas (see Flyers rules).

'Zine Reading Room

The Fanzine Reading Room is located across from hotel registration in the Executive Traveller's Lounge. It is the place to find the Fan Q ballot box, the Silent Bid Auction to raise money for the Fan Fund, and its main function: member access to the con's collection of Fanzines. This collection allows members a chance to read zines, both old and new, from over 25 fandoms in a quiet and comfortable living room-like area. Take a break from the con and relax with old and new literary friends.

We hope to have as many Fan Q nominees as possible. The 'Zine Room also "advertises" 'zines that are being sold at the con. Any of these 'zines that are on display in the 'Zine Room will carry a special notation giving the location at the con of the seller. Permanent loans are always welcome but bulk donations will only be accepted on Sunday evening between 9 and 11 pm. in the 'Zine Room. Please let Jan Gosnell know if you will be loaning 'zines to the con.

The 'Zine Room needs GoFers, especially during "regular" daily hours, but also for late night duty. Please consider volunteering -- the number of hours we are able to have the 'Zine Reading Room open is dependent on the number of GoFers available.

SF/Media Fan Fund

The SF/Media Fan Fund helps send a fan to a convention he/she would otherwise be unable to attend.

The Silent Bid Auction is the main money raising event for this con charity and is located in the Fanzine Reading Room which is across from hotel registration. Donated items can and have included 'zines, books, music cassettes and CD's, videos, T-shirts, posters and a real mixed bag of fannish collectibles. Come and take a look at the display, and just in case there is nothing that you feel like bidding on; there will be a box for cash donations.

There are some items left from last con but more are needed for this year's auction. To be included in this year's Silent bid Auction, please drop off items by 4 pm on Saturday. Any items coming in after that time will be held for next year's auction.

The Fan Fund Silent Auction begins Friday at Noon and ends at 11pm Sunday. Any items you bid on and win are your responsibility to pick up and pay for by 3pm Monday. Items may be paid for at the 'Zine Reading Room, which will remain open until 1am for pickup.

Thanks to Joyce Muskat for her generous donations of auction items, and to everyone who nominated and voted!

As there were not enough nominations to require a ballot, a cash award was made to Barbara Drake, who was the sole nominee, and her name will be carried over to the 2009 Fan Fund ballot.

Fan Quality Awards

Good luck to all the nominees, and thanks to everyone who nominated. This year there will be several ballot 'drop boxes around the con. As always we will have one in the Fanzine Reading Room (Executive Travelers' Club) -- there will also be one located near MW*C Registration, The Security Booth and in front of my room under the Black and White Cat Flag. I'm also planning to have a computer at the ready for those who would like to stop by my room and place their votes electronically. Hopefully these additions will result in more ballots actually being counted for at the con.

The Fan Q voting deadline for Attending members is 10pm Saturday. If you are hand-carrying ballots for non-members, Supporting members, or Attending members unable to come, please note: those ballots are NOT to be placed in the ballot box but given directly to Jan Keeler. Any ballots from non-attending voters placed in the box will be considered invalid.

The official Fan Q Awards Ceremony where the certificates will be handed out to the winners will be in University 1 at 6pm Sunday. Honorable mentions will also be announced at that time. The list of winners will be posted after the ceremony at the con, and afterwards in the post-con PR and on the MW*C website.

Masquerade

We'd love to have you enter the Masquerade. To help this along, entry forms will be available at the con registration desk, and in the Con Suite (463) after MW*C registration closes. Please bring the completed forms to the Con Suite. Andre Lieven will be available to answer any questions that you may have, all con, and at a couple of set times (to be posted at con registration). For those unfamiliar with the layout of the ballroom, etc, there will be a set time on Saturday afternoon when a brief "run through" will be possible. Attendance at this time will NOT be mandatory to enter. It's there to help, if you wish it.

To enter, you have to fill out a form, and to help Andre put the event together, please get the form in by 4pm on Saturday. We're not too formal as to costume rankings, and we'd love more fun entrants, too. We also invite all who bring costumes, and who wear them as part of FoE events, to enter and give attendees a good view of the work involved. Remember, this show will be what you all bring to it.

The Masquerade will go on Saturday at 10pm. We will *not* advance the start time regardless of if there are plays or not, as it would be difficult for folks in costume to deal with last minute time changes. So, it would be good for entrants to plan to be ready by 9:45pm, so that Andre can let you all know in what order you'll go in.

Blood Drive

Please remember the MW*C Blood Drive will be held in Grand Ballroom A/B Saturday from 9am - 3pm. Relax, read a 'zine, and quite likely save a life. If you have not donated blood since the end of March you should be eligible again by the con. If you can't donate, volunteer. We can probably find a way for you to help out for a while. There will be a raffle; all donors are encouraged to sign up for the chance to win prizes in exchange for their precious bodily fluids. One of the prizes will be a MW*C 29 membership. Donors will be getting Red Cross T-shirts as well.

Fannish Video Room -- Sheryl Adsit

Slash/mature videos must be on separate tapes/disks from Gen videos. Also, individual videos should be linked so that they will play in one continuous program.

If any producer has questions about which category a video belongs in, I will be able to play DVDs on my laptop prior to Friday night videos. Producers should contact me at the convention to make arrangements.

The Video Box competition also includes designs for DVD Jewel Case. And, as before, a cassette box/jewel case design can be submitted without submitting videos!

MediaWest*Con 28 Fannish Video Competition Rules

Who May Enter: All video producers must be at least supporting members of MediaWest*Con 28.

Time Limits: There is a limit of 15 minutes per person. This means that individual producers may enter 15 minutes of video; a group of four producers may enter an hour of video all together. This limit is inclusive of any credits.

Scrutiny of Group Productions Time Limit: The 15-minute per producer time limit was established in the interest of fairness. Groups such as California Crew were granted an "umbrella" time limit of 15 minutes per group member. Group time must not be unreasonably dominated by a single member of the group, or the videos will not be accepted for competition.

Tape/DVD Preparation: All entries must be in VHS or DVD format. The entry should be the only material on the cassette/disk and should begin within a few seconds of starting the tape/disk. Mature, Gen, and Slash videos must be on separate cassettes/disks. Slash includes same-sex relationships (*Queer As Folk, Will & Grace, Oz*, etc.). Videos that more than hint about a physical relationship (Slash or Gen) should be labeled Mature.

Entry Procedures: Producers should send Sheryl the list of videos (in the order they appear on the tapes/disks) and specify Song/Title, Fandom/Multi-Fandom, Category, Gen or Slash, and total running time of tape/disk. Please include producer names and contact info.

If an entry has not been completed prior to that time, producers must be ready to provide the following information for each individual video: Song/Title, Fandom/Multi-Fandom, Category, Gen or Slash, if Mature (adult) content, and total running time of tape/disk. Slash and Mature videos should be on separate tapes/disks from Gen (general audience) videos. Tape/disk entry info deadline is 11pm Thursday. All tapes and disks must be in the hands of the video competition organizer by 5pm Friday.

Failure to follow entry rules may result in disqualification of all videos by that producer or group.

There will be Gen and Slash divisions for the categories below. There will be no award in categories in which there are no competing entries.

Slash and Mature vids will be shown in separate groups, but both groups will be shown after 9 pm.

The "Mature" rating includes videos of all orientations that are of an adult nature. This would include such "steamy" examples as the Bunnies from Hell "Addicted to Love" Wiseguy video of a dozen years ago (it certainly raised the ambient room temperature back at the old Waverly Room...). Also included would be songs with questionable lyrics, such as "Big Balls" from KOBA-TV — which was ostensibly about large spheres, but was clearly intended to be a double entendre RE, ahem, manly endowment.

These "Mature" videos should be placed on a separate tape/disk, for showing in a separate session after 9 pm. The time limit per entry remains 15 minutes per producer, Mature, Slash, and Gen videos combined. Slash and Mature vids will be shown in separate groups, but both groups will be after 9pm. This will allow those who do not want to see Slash to leave after the Mature vids are played.

If a producer has any question about the "rating" of a particular video, there will be a screening session Thursday evening in the Fannish Video HQ (my room). It will be open to all producers who want to talk about video topics (not just the ratings); this is the place to see if that "artsy" video really says what you want it to.

Definitions of Categories:

Song Interpretation: The basic type of fannish video. The action interprets the title and/or lyrics of the song. This category is divided into Single fandom and Multi-Fandom entries. Outstanding examples of song interpretation are "In the Living Years" (Magnum, P.I.) by California Crew, "Hotel California" (The Prisoner) by Bunnies from Hell, "Holding Out for a Hero" (Multi-Fandom) from a number of producers.

Constructed Reality: This type of video edits together video clips to create an all-new storyline. To date, most have been Multi-Fandom, although there was a very fine *Wallace & Gromit* single medium constructed reality created to "Something Strange is Happening." Examples are "Centerfield" (multi-baseball game), and "Bohemian Rhapsody" (the detectives convention) — both by California Crew.

Humorous: These videos are intentionally funny, and can be either single Fandom or Multi-Fandom. Con

Dog's "Just When You Need Someone to Turn To" (Beauty & the Beast to the tune of the Sheba cat food commercial) and California Crew's "Trigger Happy" (Multi-Fandom gun footage, including the best use of the royal Moldavian wedding massacre sequence from Dynasty) are outstanding examples.

Original: As the name implies, this is for the occasional foray into original video production. Less than 10% of the video may be "quoted" material from media sources. The subject matter should be of general fannish interest. California Crew created a video to the tune of "Pressure" about a weekend spent editing a fannish video.

Credits: With the rise in video software for personal computers, credits have become more and more sophisticated. This category includes opening and closing credits, as well as any credits between videos.

Video Box/DVD Jewel Case: This category may be entered by anyone with a video box/jewel case (there need not be any music videos entered). The inclusion of this category was prompted by the outstanding graphic work of Steele. Inc. -- Atlanta Division in boxing their *Remington Steele* videos.

Flyer: In years past, California Crew and Steele, Inc. — Atlanta Division have created their own flyers to publicize the contents of their competition videos, independent of the schedule postings of the Fannish Video Competition. We decided to add this Category to the 2000 MW*C Competition to promote creativity among video fen. As with Video Box/DVD Jewel Case, an entrant need not have any actual video(s) to show. This would be an excellent way to showcase that killer video concept that you never got around to making. Entries in the Flyer category would be displayed outside the Fannish Video Room for all to enjoy.

What Happens Next: Competition videos are shown three times over the course of the convention. They are "premiered" during Friday Night Videos, then shown once each on Saturday and Sunday. The order of play is varied during each showing so that no video suffers (or shines) in comparison to any other played before or afterward. Also, the videos are scheduled at different times of day to accommodate as many fans as possible. Gen and Slash videos will be scheduled separately.

Balloting: Ballots will be available Friday night. Fans may list their favorite three videos in all categories. Three points are awarded for each first place vote, two points for second, and one point for third. In case of a tie for first place in any category, the video receiving the most first place votes will win. Ballots are due at noon on Monday.

Entry "Fee": There is no monetary fee for entering videos in the competition. However, due to the need for staffing the Fannish Video Room, each producer will be expected to provide one hour of attendance in the room for each 15 minutes of video entered. Thus, a single video producer would be expected to arrange to be in the room for one hour during the convention. A group of four producers with an hour of videos would be expected to provide four hours of coverage. The specific hour(s) would be arranged Friday afternoon, at the time the competition videos are turned in.

Main Video Room -- Robyn Deike

Videotaped programming at MW*C is provided to creatively further the interests of society through the study of techniques used in television, film, and other media. Videotapes are used productively to further interest and self-expression through the visual arts and literature, and we believe this to be a fair usage not intended as any form of copyright infringement.

There's something for everyone in the Main Video Room this year. Thank you so much for all the suggestions and loans!

The Rules: PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE when watching shows or just standing near the room; voices, spoilers, and the rustling of candy wrappers all carry very well. Pets are not strictly excluded, but they must be kept under control and quiet. If you have children, it is your responsibility to check that the rating of a show is within the limits that you feel are appropriate; if you have questions about a show, please ask me.

The schedule is FULL. If you have something to show and nowhere else to show it, check with the Con Suite first (they may be interested in seeing it there), then talk to me (I might be able to keep the room open late for you).

Host Hotel: The Holiday Inn South/Convention Center

HIS has promised not to let any unclaimed rooms go to non-members, even if that means they go empty, so please don't forget to check for any rooms available due to no-shows at the con! If you are on the HIS waiting list you may wish to leave your name and how you can be reached at the hotel front desk in case rooms become available.

HIS has put new carpet in the second and third floor guest rooms as well as new wallpaper/vinyl in those rooms. Hummingbirds has a new look with the new wall colors, booth and bench upholsty and barstools. They've painted and decorated the hallway outside of Hummingbirds Restaurant and the West cooridor at the South and West entrances to the building, and aquired 400 brand new banquet chairs. Two of the Lake Suites have new sofas.

Please **DO NOT** use scotch tape to adhere flyers and posters to the walls! Single sided masking tape is acceptible. And no taping of any kind on the newly painted walls (the paint will not be hardened by the time the con starts).

We will **not** be doing live in-house broadcasts of events. Please be aware that times listed on the **Holiday Inn/South** closed-circuit TV system crawl are times the facilities are booked, and **not** the **MW*C** programming schedule.

If you are staying in the **Holiday Inn South** and need to return to the Lansing airport upon departing the hotel, please contact the hotel's front desk as soon as possible to make your shuttle arrangements. If you're planning on requesting a late check-out, please let the hotel know as soon as possible to see if this is possible.

For those with VCRs, you must request hook-up assistance upon check-in; the hotel will send someone up ASAP, and at no charge.

Don't forget, if you are staying at the **Holiday Inn South**, you are supposed to register your pet. For those with dogs, please stop at convention registration as needed to pick up a supply of doggie bags, as you are requested to walk your dog in one of the two official dog walk areas (see map); trash cans and pooper scoopers will be available at both locations. Please clean up with either the scoopers or the baggies. In case of in-hotel accidents, ask for the clean-up kit available at **convention** registration. We appreciate your cooperation. Concerning **all** pets, please do not leave pets loose in your room when unsupervised. Be considerate of the hotel, or pets may be banned in the future.

If you want your room made up early, look for maids about 8-9 am and let them know.

The hotel warns that their fire alarms are exceedingly sensitive — please be careful if you intend to burn incense or otherwise potentially stress the system. All alarms are treated as real until proven otherwise, and false alarms can prove costly in terms of fire department manpower expenditures.

The fire code prohibits the use of hot plates, microwaves, etc. in rooms. This is a safety issue as the wiring is not rated for such excess usage.

The hotel will operate on a one-for-one dirty towel exchange; whenever you need a clean towel, just request one from housekeeping and turn in a dirty one. This helps avoid peak usage and seemed to work out well last year.

Judging will take place between noon Saturday and noon Sunday. Overall judging will be based on the following criteria: Artistic Impression (pretty), Cleverness, Humor, Originality, Technical/Complexity, and Workmanship (neatness counts). Awards will be certificates of recognition.

General Info:


Measurements for HIS Doors (See illustration):

- (A) Total Height: 78.5"
- (B)Total Width: 35"
- (F) Doorknob/Lock Box: 9" x 3.5" (Note: can be on left or right side of door.)
- (C) From top of Doorknob box to top of Door: 33"
- (D) From Bottom of Door to bottom of Doorknob Box: 36.5"
- (E) Far Edge of Door to Doorknob box: 30.75"

Peephole is centered about 20" below top of door.

(Please note all measurements are approximate. No two doors are exactly alike, as with all things built and/or installed by humans there is variation in the finished product.)

Doors are veneer covered wood. Please use only low-tack tape, like blue painter's tape (preferred) or masking tape, to attach things to doors. Do not use Scotch tape, it may remove the finish from the door. Door frames are metal, made up of several pieces of stacked molding, consider using magnets to attach items to the door frames. The hallways in HIS have drop ceilings with acoustical tiles. If you wish to hang things from the hallway ceilings consider using drop-ceiling hooks (inexpensive, they clamp onto the metal support struts) available from Home Depot or Lowe's type stores, or for very lightweight items, use a push pin or thumbtack. Do not use any tape on the ceilings. Finally, please use common sense when utilizing hallway space in your decorating. Many more con-goers are using motorized scooters to get around. Cluttering the floor can be dangerous. Try to keep materials within a "room service trav's" distance of the wall.

Those of you who are new to **MediaWest*Con** may not be familiar with the reasons behind the hotel reservation request system which was implemented many years ago; as such, we thought the following history would bear repeating.

Due to experiences in having to share hotel space with a high school prom and a softball league early on, we learned to book all hotel function space and to block all sleeping rooms with preference for MW*C members; the best way to avoid conflicts with non-members is not to have them around. This policy has been in effect since 1982.

After the failure of the old hotel to fulfill these contractual obligations during MediaWest*Con 11 (1991), we agreed to hold MediaWest*Con 12 at the Holiday Inn South (where they had been actively seeking our business for years). The new hotel was more than happy to have the volume of business MW*C represents. Shortly before MW*C 13, the hotel decided that they wanted to take room reservation requests during MW*C 13 for the following year, so we agreed on a system which was then noted in the Program Book. The hotel did not get the forms to us in time to include them in the membership packets; while the forms were eventually available at both con registration and the hotel reservation desk, many members remained unaware that advanced registration requests were possible.

Even so, the number of people taking advantage of this opportunity were far greater than was anticipated, resulting in long lines Monday morning (complicating the check-out process). The hotel staff was overwhelmed, receiving reservation requests for the following year in excess of the available rooms before the end of the con (the hotel now considers their taking room reservation requests during the con to be a BAD IDEA). Understandably, those who were shut out also brought the matter to our attention, pointing out that this system favored those already staying in the host hotel (by general proximity and access to the forms) and discriminated against those staying in other hotels (proximity and access to forms), full members who were unable to attend (due to lack of advance notice), Supporting members (same), and any others who might later become members. As always, we listened to member input and took steps to address these concerns.

We addressed the concern of those who questioned the randomness of the process by fine-tuning the procedure in adding the random selection (by Attending members' own hands) of numbered ticket stubs, which determined the order in which reservation requests were processed (again, with the knowledge and consent of hotel management).

As with any change, we fully expected that some people would have questions and/or objections, and we have tried to address them. Not surprisingly, many of the objections/suggestions we received (in all forms) reflected a lack of understanding of the problems inherent in putting on a convention, as well as problems unique to **MediaWest*Con**; the average attendee, and some more experienced members, are simply unaware of many things we have to take into consideration.

The fact of the matter is that the **MediaWest*Con 15** hotel reservation request system accomplished what it was intended to. Hotel check-out Monday morning was not impeded. Attending, non-attending, Supporting, and new members were given an equal chance at getting a room in the host hotel. We were able to verify membership numbers quickly, and pass on the forms to the hotel so that they were able to assign rooms and get out the confirmations ahead of schedule.

Some minor changes have been made to tweak the system over the years.

We had hoped the planned hotel expansion would alleviate the need for the present system. However, in the post-9/11 economy, it doesn't look like the expansion will be done any time soon. So, for now, it just isn't possible for everyone to have a room in the host hotel. We have simply tried to create a system that addresses that problem in as fair a manner as possible.

You can help the system run more smoothly by writing legibly, and by following directions. Please help us help you.

Back To The Future

MediaWest*Con will once again be held next Memorial Day Weekend, May 22-25, 2009, at the Holiday Inn — South. As always, the hotel will be giving preference to MW*C 29 members in assigning rooms. The instructions for the early reservation process are on the back of the HIS reservation request form.

Early HIS Reservation Request Procedure for MediaWest*Con 29

- 1. You must first be registered as an Attending member of MediaWest*Con 29.
- 2. Fill out the HIS reservation request form as indicated.

Please DO NOT list the primary name also as guest sharing room.

Please list the MW*C 29 membership numbers (NOT membership numbers from MW*C 28) of all listed as guests sharing rooms. Those listed as guests sharing rooms should NOT submit separate forms.

Please indicate the qualifying relationship of anyone listed as guest sharing room who is not a MW*C 29 member (parent, child, spouse, etc.).

Those requesting adjoining or connecting rooms should submit those forms together, and a reservation request form is required for each guest room.

3. Some rooms will be set aside for those with physical disabilities; if you qualify for this exception, you must still submit a reservation request form, check off the "physical hardship" box, and provide documentation of your qualifying medical condition (handicap parking permit, doctor's note, etc.). You must provide such documentation even if you also did so in previous years as neither HIS or MW*C keep medical documents on file from previous years.

Those claiming physical hardships must also select a ticket number (or have a ticket number selected for them), which will determine the order in which physical hardship claims are processed.

4. Early reservation requests will be processed by HIS in the order determined by the number of the randomly selected ticket attached to the form.

Each MW*C 29 member listed on the form (or group of forms) may select a ticket; the lowest number ticket should then be attached. MW*C 29 members attending MW*C 28 may select their own tickets; MW*C 29 members who do not attend MW*C 28 will have tickets randomly selected for them.

Please keep a record of the ticket number on your form and include it in any inquiry as to your hotel status.

5. Reservation request forms will be collected at MW*C 29 registration during MW*C 28, by mail at 200 E. Thomas St., Lansing MI 48906-4047, and by FAX at 517/372-0738. An online HIS reservation request form will be available on the MW*C website (www.mediawestcon.org) after the conclusion of MW*C 28.

Reservation requests for MW*C 98 will NOT be accepted at the hotel front desk during MW*C 28, or at the hotel by mail or FAX, nor will HIS take reservations by phone.

 Forms must be received by July 1, 2006 (a month after MW*C 28) to be included in the early reservation request process.

After the membership information on the forms is verified, the forms will be turned over to the hotel; HIS will process the forms in the order determined by the attached ticket numbers.

HIS will send out confirmations by August 31, 2008 (about 9 months before **MediaWest*Con 29**) to the primary name on each reservation request form; confirmations will NOT be sent to those listed as guests sharing rooms, so please remember whose name is at the top of your form; you may wish to make a photocopy of your form and ticket stub to expedite any later inquiries. Two-part tickets will be provided so you may keep one for your reference.

HIS will also send notices to the primary name on each form of those who follow the early reservation request procedure and do not immediately receive room reservations that they remain on the HIS MW*C 29 member preference list; they will be notified as rooms become available prior to MW*C 29, unless they notify the hotel they wish to be removed from the waiting list.

Additional Reservation Requests

New members may be added to the MediaWest*Con 29 member preference list after the early reservation request deadline by the following procedure:

- 1. Fill out the HIS reservation request form as indicated above.
- 2. No ticket number is required; reservation requests received after the early reservation request deadline will be added to the waiting list in the order received.
- 3. Mail the form to 200 E. Thomas St., Lansing MI 48906-4047 or FAX it to 517/372-0738. An online HIS reservation request form will also be available on the MW*C website (www.mediawestcon.org).

DO NOT mail or FAX the form to HIS; HIS will NOT take reservations by phone for MW*C 29.

Fannish Videos, Masquerade, Dealers' Room, SF/Media Fan Fund, Fan Quality Awards, a Con Suite (AKA Hospitality Suite) and a Party Suite, and many, many panels on a wide variety of topics representing many areas of interest. Programming is determined by member input and participation; a form for suggesting topics will be included in a future Progress Report. Programming is intended for an adult audience; we do not censor adult themes in panel topics or in the Art Show. We have no official guests. The name MediaWest*Con is a service mark of MediaWest*Con.

Once again, MediaWest*Con 29 will be held in Lansing, Michigan on Memorial Day Weekend, May 22-25, 2009. As always, programming will be determined by member input and participation. We urge you to register early, so you can participate in planning for MW*C 29.

Memberships will be available to MW*C 28 members at MW*C 28 registration (see postings for day & time). Due to increased costs in postage, bank charges, etc., the cost of Attending membership for people outside the US will be slightly higher.

MW*C 28 members may receive a discounted rate of \$37/\$42 for those outside the US for MW*C 29 Attending membership if registration is dated through June 30, 2008. Attending memberships for all others (including MW*C 28 members after June 30) is \$42/\$47 outside the US through Dec. 31, 2008. All Attending memberships postmarked after Dec. 31, 2008 are \$50/\$55 outside the US, until either Attending membership limits of 900 is reached or May 1, 2009, whichever comes first. NO MEMBERSHIPS WILL BE SOLD AT THE DOOR. Memberships are NOT transferable. Memberships are subject to acceptance.

GoFers receive a greatly discounted membership rate of \$15 (as low as Supporting!) for working a minimum of 10 hours during the four days of the con. We will try to accommodate specific scheduling requests based on the order they are received.

Supporting memberships are \$15. All non-attending Art Show participants must be at least Supporting members.

Supporting members will receive all Progress Reports and other membership materials, will be entitled to nominate and vote for Fan Q's, as well as be eligible for a discount on Attending membership to next year's con.

Apocryphal memberships are \$1, for live animals, stuffed animals, or alternate identities.

Single day passes and children's memberships are NOT available. Babes in arms and children in direct control of parents or guardians at all times do not need memberships; if a child is old enough to be on his/her own, they need an Attending membership.

PAYMENT: Checks should be made payable to MediaWest*Con, in US funds from US banks only, please; money orders should be made out to Lori Chapek-Carleton.

Credit card payments will only be accepted online through PayPal. See details on the MW*C website.

IMPORTANT: Be certain to list your address including ZIP + 4 & phone number including area code. You may be listed under a fannish name if you wish, but we must also have your legal name for our records. Only the fannish name will be printed in PRs, but we will print legal names on the mailing labels unless you have a legitimate reason not to (such as personal security issues), as we have had problems with the PO not delivering to fannish names — and please remember what name you are registered under, so we can find you next year!

We will try to accommodate all membership changes (new memberships, converting from Supporting to Attending, or from Attending to Supporting, etc.) received up to the May 1 deadline. Attending members who are unable to attend may be switched to Supporting, \$15 will be held for the conversion, and the balance they paid will be refunded; after the first Progress Report is mailed, full refunds will only be made in cases of personal hardship. No membership changes or refunds will be made after the May 1 deadline.

Progress Reports will be sent to members, including Fan Q nomination forms and ballots, Fan Fund nomination forms and ballots, Art Show space reservation request forms, and other useful information. Art Show rules and space reservation request form will be included in a future PR.

Once you have registered as a MediaWest*Con 29 attendee, you will be eligible to get a place on the host hotel's room reservation request list (see instructions). A number of rooms are held for MW*C members with physical handicaps (or members who become handicapped); such members must still submit the reservation request form, check the "physical hardship" box, and include a doctor's note or other documentation of their qualifying disability.
